## Instructions from the FHSAA:

Explain unsportsmanlike conduct for each offending person(s). Accurately quote vulgar language or profanity used. Provide first & last name and number of offending athlete(s). Provide first & last name of offending coach(es) and/or school representative(s)

## Instructions from CFU:

Describe the circumstances preceding, during, and after the ejection. Be as accurate as possible. If you know the exact words, write the exact words. If a team member called you "a fucking pussy", put that in the report. Do not abbreviate or censor yourself. The FHSAA needs to know exactly what happened to make an appropriate ruling.

DO NOT LIE. DO NOT EMBELLISH. DO NOT OMIT.

## Sample Ejection Report

Name of Person Disqualified: Tom Jones

Position: Coach School: Springfield

Reason for Disqualification: Unsportsmanlike Conduct

Brief Explanation:

During the plate meeting, the coach for Springfield, Tom Jones, commented that the umpires from last night were "horrible" and hoped we would be better. My partner informed Jones that we were not here to discuss last night's game or last night's umpires.

In the bottom of the 4th, Shelbyville was leading 4-2. With no outs and runners on 1st & 2nd, the Springfield batter hit a ground ball to the shortstop. He threw to 2nd for the force, and the Springfield runner interfered with the second baseman by making contact outside a direct line to the base. I called interference on the runner, declared the batter out, and returned the other runner to 2nd. Jones came out of the dugout to argue the interference call. He said "how can you make that call?" I told him the play was right in front of me, the runner slid outside the bag and made contact with the fielder. By book rule, that is interference and the batter is also out. Jones then asked his runner if he touched the fielder. I told Jones, "coach, I made the call. Not the runner. Whatever he says doesn't matter in the ruling." Jones replied "so you're calling my player a liar?" I issued a verbal warning to Jones. He then waved his hand at me and said "you're worse than the guys last night." I then issued a written warning and restricted Jones to the dugout. Declaring the conversation over, I turned and walked to the outfield.

Jones yelled at me "so you're going to walk away? Turn around you coward." At this point I ejected the coach. I started to walk toward the plate, and Jones followed me. My partner intervened and asked several times for Jones to leave. Jones said "you two are terrible, I'm calling the assigner, you will never work here again." Finally the assistant coach escorted Jones from the field. He kicked over a bucket of balls on his way out of the field. The game resumed and concluded with no further incidents.
